ASSESSMENT NOTICES

Notice is hereby given in accordance with the provisions of Section 311 of the Municipal Government Act, statutes of Alberta, 2000, chapter M-26.

The County of Paintearth No. 18 has mailed assessment notices to all persons appearing on the assessment roll as of February 28, 2025.

Any person who desires to object to the entry of his/her name or that of any other person upon the said roll or to the assessed value placed upon any property must lodge his/her complaint(s) in writing and submit to the clerk of the Assessment Review Board **on or before May 20, 2025**.

In accordance with the municipal government act and the County of Paintearth no. 18 Schedule of Fees Bylaw, a charge is required for each assessment appeal. The fee is refundable if the Assessment Review Board makes a decision in the favor of the complainant, pursuant to 481(2) of the Municipal Government Act. The Board may refund fees to other complainants at their discretion.

Assessment complaints, with the applicable fee, can be forwarded to Michael Simpson, clerk of the Assessment Review Board of the County of Paintearth no. 18, Box 509, Castor, Alberta T0C 0X0.

All assessed persons are deemed to have received their notice as a result of this publication. If you have not received an assessment notice for property you own in the County of Paintearth No. 18, please contact the County office at 403-882-3211.

TAX PAYMENT DEADLINE

To avoid penalty charges, payments must be received or postmarked on or before the due date (June 30, 2025). Where a deadline for payments of taxes falls on a weekend or holiday, the deadline is deemed to fall on the next business date, and no penalties shall be applied until the day after the deemed deadline in accordance with the *Interpretations Act, RSA 2000, C-18*.

PRE- AUTHORIZED MONTHLY TAX PAYMENTS

The monthly instalment payments shall be estimated based on the current assessment, multiplied by the previous year tax rates applicable to the property. Adjusted equal monthly payments shall be calculated following the establishment of the actual current year tax levy. Call 403-882-3211 for more information.

COMMUNITY GARDEN

Garden plots will be ready by May 16, 2025, for residents who wish to participate. To secure a plot, please complete the registration form and submit it to the Administration Office by May 9 or contact Jeff Cosens, Director of Environmental Services, or register by email at jcosens@Countypaintearth.ca or phone 403-882-3211. All plots must be paid for prior to planting. There are a total of 20 plots and will be assigned on a first come, first served basis. Any remaining plots after initial registration may be offered to those wishing to have more than one. The County will provide the garden with water via drip irrigation. Link for the registration form can be found on the County website.

There will be no fire permits issued by the County of Paintearth No.18 which will remain in effect until further notice.

Fires are only to be burned in approved fire pits, approved incinerators or approved burning barrels as per County Bylaw 675-19.
